Due to late start July minutes were not approved and will be brought forward again in September for approval.

- LE contract update- details were sent out in an email with PRISM link to snapshot and links to County meeting where contract was discussed. LE coordinator has been attending monthly meetings the other Whidbey Basin LEs and sharing grant round projects and funding distribution information. Sharing Manual 18 requirements and reports for end of the year.
- Whidbey Basin Coordination
 - Review SRFB grant round and projects funded. Review Riparian funding proposals together.
- Funding/SRFB
 - SRFB rank list submitted and reviewed with group. SRFB meeting Sept 13-14 for final project funding allocation. Rank 1 Middle Crescent Creek with remaining funding to Keystone Preserve cost overruns.
- Island County Marine Resources Committee (MRC)
 - The MRC is still working on the Climate Change and Sea level rise white paper to present to BOCC. MRC looking for support from SRTCC saying SRTCC agrees with suggestions in the paper.

MRC hard armoring RFP proposal moving forward and results will help decisionmakers. MRC to present some information on these concerns at the next meeting. Fred has questions about permit review and information was shared about Shore Friendly program with request for Shore Friendly presentation.

Shared Whidbey Basin group providing feedback on preference for option one where each LE gets a portion of riparian funding. LE allocation option would include- Acquisition, Riparian planting, Invasive removal, Stewardship, Assessment, and limited instream and floodplain restoration.

- Breakdown of poll for SRTCC and who would like to provide input for different topics. Review of information to be shared with smaller groups.
- Camano Country Club update

Kristin M of Snohomish Conservation District invited to give verbal update on the project. She thanked SRTCC members for helpful input. Country Club board is supportive of moving forward. SCD thankful for the SRTCC subcommittee feedback helpful to final proposal preference. New feedback from public works caused some frustration from SRTCC members. RCO has not given feedback as to comments on if the amount of restoration is salmon friendly enough. They will have to look at other funding if RCO does not think there is enough benefit. The Conservation District needs to hear from some key property holders. SCD is using internal funding to keep moving forward with the project. After we receive RCO comments then present this information again to SRTCC or SRTCC subcommittee. SCD would like input before next grant round. Mathew would like to see other options because the cost is so high. Each element has a cost impact. Kristin has been sharing information with Nick T in public works. Barbara has been at the site often this summer and will send out some pictures with how the channel has been changing. Todd mentioned that the County needs to use caution with the “No bridge” comment. The way the comment was written with all capital letters was disturbing and offensive. Public works continues to talk about how they do not have a bridge program. At some point the county will need to prepare for bridges. Todd is supportive and ready to help Island County prepare for bridge program. - Projects experiencing delays- Polnell 20-1559
- Review of funding opportunities, PSEMP, upcoming outreach events and opportunities (Fair-past, Camano 101, library) updating lessons learned document with our consistent main complication to projects being private owners.
- Priority Area 2 report updates, with all concerns addressed. Will send out final review to sub group interested and finalize what will be updated in PRISM. Penn Cove culvert replacement project was hoping to have the support of the priority review area 2 habitat report. In the future we would need to add reports together and create a list of top projects with hope of having an outside group bring these projects up to a percentage complete to prove they are projects that could be successful.
- Race Road project update 22-1089. If the project moves forward to phase 2 it would need to be sponsored by Island County, as they are county culverts needing to be replaced. Public works would like to know what year would be preferred to construct. Alison recommends applying this coming grant round for work in 2025.
- Future meeting plans for online, hybrid or in person meetings. We are one of the most diverse boards in Island County with many people attending at work, so hard to change meeting time or in person.
- Watershed characterization map questions from CAs. CAs are learning more and will share what they learn. Questions on off-site mitigation proposal.
- PSP, ECB, LIO are reviewing Sound Choices Checklist. Will send links to those interested.
