

Key Findings from Tribal Listening Sessions

Dive into this interesting report, with results suggesting Northwest coastal Tribes face significant barriers and unmet needs in realizing their adaptation goals, despite being leaders in climate adaptation. Key barriers and needs focus around five key areas: funding; Tribal staff and workforce capacity; collaboration and partnerships; technical assistance and climate services; and communication, education and outreach.

Volunteers Monitor Bull Kelp, a Key 'Ecosystem Engineer'

Our MRSC volunteers were featured in the Whidbey -Times for their work monitoring bull kelp for a collaborative project studying kelp in the Salish Sea. Bull kelp is an annual seaweed, growing from a spore to maturity in a single year. It can reach up to 100 feet tall at a rate of 10 inches per day. Of the 17 species of kelp in the Salish Sea, bull kelp is the only one that provides canopy. It can serve as a refuge from changing environmental pressures and a rest from predators for juvenile animals. Fisheries rely on kelp and seagrass for these reasons.
