

Water Facilities Inventory (WFI) Report Updates

Island County Code 8.09.060 – Group B public water systems states that an updated Water Facilities Inventory (WFI) report is to be submitted to the Island County Health Department every 3 years or whenever there is a change in name, connections, ownership, or management.

What is a WFI report?

The WFI report provides information about your water system, such as:

- Name and contact information of the water system owner and primary contact
- The water system's water sources and treatment (if applicable)
- The type and number of connections and population served

This information is used to determine the type of water system and monitoring requirements, and for communication purposes.

How do I update my WFI report?

You need to review your current WFI report and make any changes necessary. To review and print or download your WFI report, access the WFI page on the Washington State Department of Health [Sentry](#) site.





To make corrections or update information, print the report, cross out the wrong information on the WFI and write or type the correct information next to it. If no changes were made, mark box 35 “Update – No Change”. When complete, sign and print your name, title, and date.

To submit your updated WFI you may either email a PDF copy or mail a paper copy to Island County Public Health.
