We made some awesome progress in 2024!

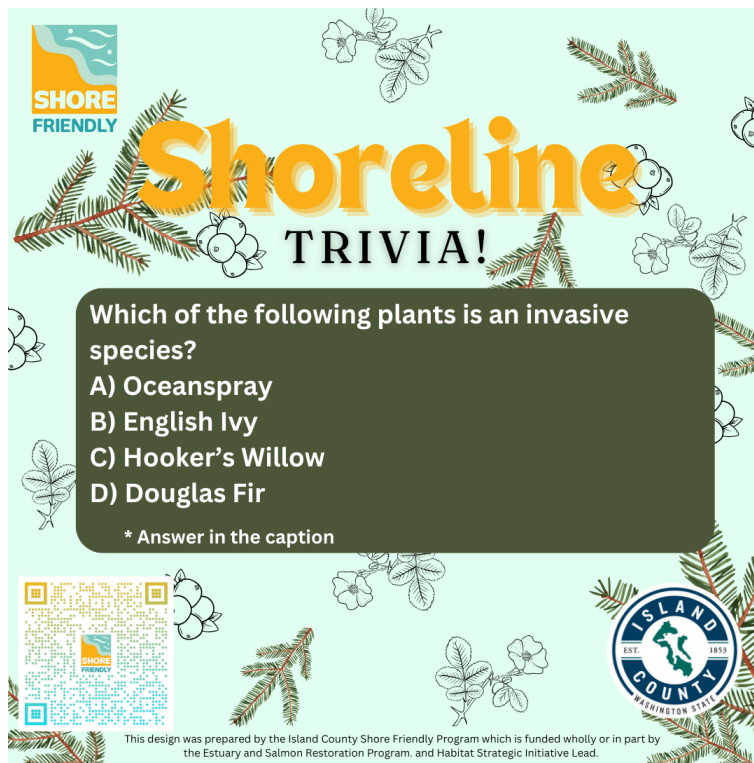
In 2024, the Marine Resources Committee removed two derelict vessels. We submitted comments on every element in the Comprehensive Plan, completed monthly Forage Fish surveys in five locations, conducted kayak surveys at five key beds around Island County during the summer growing season, watered and cared for two restoration sites, and hosted a workshop for shoreline homeowners!
