Drinking Water Winter 2025

Happy New Year!



We wish you well! This time of year is a great time to make goals and plans for the year ahead. Including Healthy Actions in your plans can help keep your drinking water safe.

Healthy Actions:

- Replace the water filter in the fridge (follow the manufacturer's recommendation).
- Maintain water softeners and other water treatment systems.
- Safely store potential pollutants at least 100 feet from any wells.
- Inspect the visible parts of your well.
- Measure and track the static water level in your well.
- Schedule routine water quality testing for your well.
- Schedule chloride and conductivity testing for April and August, if seawater intrusion monitoring is required.
- Schedule an inspection for your septic system.
- And update Water Facilities Inventory ([WFI](#)) reports.
